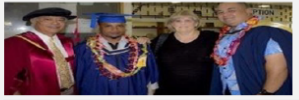

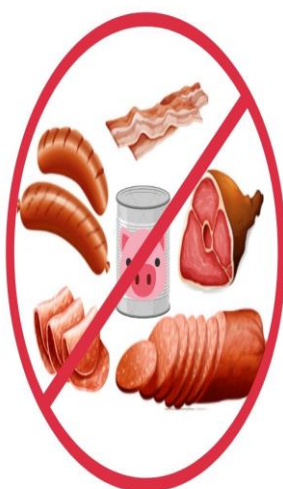

Bill of Lading (BoL), Sea Freight or Airway Bill (AWB), Sea Freight containing:

- Name of Consignee (Person uplifting the Cargo)
- Name of Sender/ Supplier
- Total number of pieces & weight
- Description (e.g. Personal Effects)
- Invoice/ Receipts

### IMPORTANT REMINDER:

It is very important for all Freight Forwarders to prepare BS4 entry for clearance of Cargo (Personal Effects). All information on the BoL /AWB must be the same information on the BS4 entry examination.

### PROCESS

FREIGHT FORWARDERS prepare BS4 entry with BOL/AWB

Submit BS4 entry with BOL/AWB to Customs Officer. Consignee must be present

Freight Forwarders present the Shipment for Examination

Freight Forwarders to reseal the shipment after examination

## Quarantine Office

### WHAT IS A PESTICIDE?

A substance or mixture of substance which:

- Is used for preventing, destroying, or controlling any pest, or
- May be administered to animals for the control of insects, arachnids or other pests in/on their bodies

### Guidelines to Register Pesticides?

1. Submit complete application form to the Registrar of Pesticides
2. Submission and discussion of the pesticide application to the Pesticide Technical Committee for approval
3. Pesticide Technical Committee determine whether the application can be Registered, on Hold or Refused

4. Approval of the application to be Registered
5. A 5 years validity certificate of Pesticides is issued
6. A permit to import must be obtained which is annually renewed

### WHY MUST YOU REGISTER A PESTICIDE?

Any form of pesticide must be registered to ensure that it complies with the relevant conditions in respect of the import, manufacture, packing, labelling, storage, sale, distribution, advertising, application, possession or safe use of the pesticide

#### ENTERING SAMOA

It is important that you help us Protect Samoa from Pests and Diseases. You must Declare or Dispose of any Risk Items at the Port of Entry. You might have goods with you that could be carrying pests and diseases. Samoa being vulnerable to changes, these pests and diseases could cause havoc to our country's environment and economy, Thus creating stress to the livelihoods of our people and children.

#### FOLLOW THESE 3 SIMPLE STEPS

1. Complete and honestly fill out your Passenger Arrival Card. Declare any risk goods
2. Dispose of any risk goods or agricultural items that you have not declared, in the Biosecurity Amnesty Bins
3. Present your Passenger Arrival Card to our Quarantine staff. Declared risk goods may then be inspected. Your bags may be sniffed by detector dogs, x-rayed or searched

#### WHAT HAPPENS TO DECLARED GOODS

After inspection, our biosecurity officers would return your declared goods if they are safe or have met Quarantine requirements. However, some goods may require treatment. Any prohibited items will be destroyed.

#### RISK GOODS YOU MUST DECLARE

All of these goods are a risk to Samoa and must be declared. If you are not sure, declare.

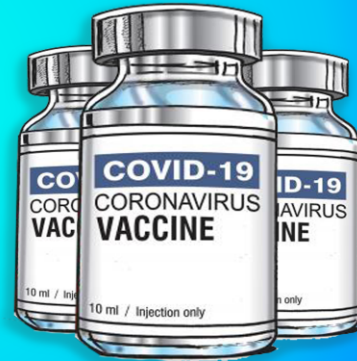
